Shift from 3f's to functionality

1. Devolution of power to performance based service delivery. (ex: Panchayat Advancement Index)
2. Limited local autonomy to evidence based participatory planning with outcome tracking (ex: Gram Panchayat Development Plan).
3. Manual processes to end-to-end digital integration. (ex: eGram Swaraj).
4. Top down administrative control to citizen centric governance. (ex: Meghalaya made social audit mandatory).
5. Recruitment of functionaries to to skilling. (ex: focus on digital literacy)

Challenges faced by local bodies

1. Inadequate own source revenue generation, ULBs of India -> 0.6% of GDP -> RBI
2. Resource - expenditure gap. (ex:) 42% gap in UBLs across 18 states - CAG
3. low overall dendution score. from 40% (2013-14) to 44% (2021-22) - NITI Aayog
4. Premature dissolution of elected bodies. (ex: all 27 ULBs of Maharashtra operating without elected bodies).
5. Severe staff vacancies. 37%, avg Vacancy - PRS India.
6. Institutional delay: only 9/28 states have constituted state finance commission.

W -> implement Samarth Parchuryat -> tax collection

A -> SVAMITRA scheme using drones -> property tax

Y -> enhance fiscal federalism -> Finance Commission

A -> Mandatory full-time secretary.

H -> Administrative autonomy in recruitment. (ex: Rashtriya gram Swaraj Abhiyan).

Key Strengths

- Clear understanding of the '3Fs' concept and its evolution towards 'Functionality'.

Areas for Improvement

Introduction

- While the introduction sets the stage well, the explanation of the 'shift' from 3Fs to functionality could be more explicit and analytical, rather than just listing aspects of functionality.

Body

- The section 'Shift from 3f's to functionality' tends to list reforms or aspects of functionality rather than clearly explaining the *transition* or the *meaning* of functionality in contrast to the 3Fs.
- The concluding points (W, A, Y, A, H, b) are a bit disjointed and could be better integrated into a structured 'Way Forward' or 'Recommendations' section.
- The challenges could be categorized under broader headings (e.g., Financial, Administrative, Political, Capacity Building) for better structure and flow.

Conclusion

- The conclusion is a bit abrupt and fragmented. It should offer a more cohesive summary and a forward-looking perspective.

In-Line Corrections

~~"2. Discretionary – porket library"~~

The term 'porket library' appears to be a misspelling. It should likely be 'public library' or 'pocket library' depending on the intended meaning.

~~"3. External – Consolidation fund of State – Finance Commission"~~

'Consolidation fund of State' should be 'Consolidated Fund of the State'. Also, the Finance Commission *recommends* funds and measures for fiscal federalism, it is not a fund itself.
